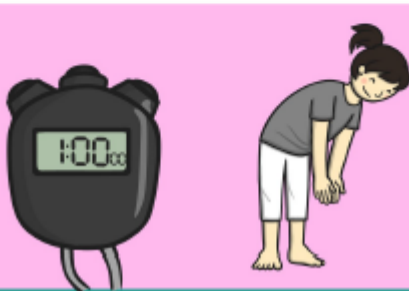
Jump up and down like a kangaroo for 1 minute.

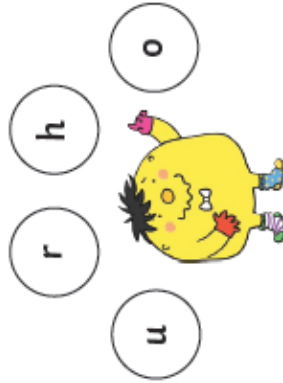
