	stage are acceptable, but your child could also be
	asked to draw and label the answer to these
	questions. In addition, please try to read as often as
	you can and complete your reading journal. Reading

Writing	In class this week we will be looking at We're Going
	On a Lion Hunt by David Axtell. Please use the

	This will give you an online version of the story. This
	is a retelling of Michael Rosen's classic We're Going
	On A Bear Hunt. Sequence the pictures from the
	story in the order they appear and write a sentence
	together about the picture.
SPAG	2 exercises have been provided which will
	complement the genre of writing your child will be
	completing. One is a cut and stick activity where
	your child will need to sequence the images and
	attach the correct phrase i.e. picture of grass and
	swish swash. Ask your child to add 'sound buttons'
	to aid their reading of the phrase. The other activity

	consolidation purposes. Look as the four images,
	write the phrase that complements the images.
Foundation Subjects	An activity has been provided which the children will be completing in class. This activity is a science based one whereby your child needs to keep a weekly weather chart. You should comment on the type of weather experienced and draw the relevant symbol. Further to this, attached is four trees which have labels: Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter. You child will need to colour the relevant leaves on the tree to display the season.
