The following work has been set for any Year 1 child who may be self-isolating during this week. Please complete the activities in your Home Learning book and return this to school when your period of isolation is complete. Thank you.

Maths	Please see the Maths links provided for our present Unit of work, which is addition and subtraction. Each lesson has a video that will explain what work is being completed on each day and an exercise to complete. The school office will inform you which lesson you should start from.
Reading	A fiction text has been provided, which is in-line with your child's current phonic stage. Please read the book carefully with your child and work through the questions at the back. Verbal responses at this stage are acceptable, but your child could also be asked to draw and label the answer to these questions. In addition, please try to read as often as you can and complete your reading journal. Reading Rocket star stickers will be awarded on return to school.
Writing	<p>In class this week we will again be looking at <i>We're Going On a Lion Hunt</i> by David Axtell. Please use the following link:</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ECYiUsppM14</p> <p>This will give you an online version of the story. This is a retelling of Michael Rosen's classic <i>We're Going On A Bear Hunt</i>. The tasks attached are sequencing the story and writing a short phrase/sentence next to each picture and sequencing sentences from the story in order familiarise the children with specific story language. I have also attached a creative task: making African animal puppets, as they are present in this brilliant story. Colour and retell the story using these animals as characters!</p>
SPAG	All of this week's exercises are focused on caption-based work around the pictures shown. Look at the pictures provided, and your child will need to write

	<p>a word/phrase/sentence based on the picture. Encourage your child to use phonics to help them sound out and spell their words accurately.</p>
Foundation Subjects	<p>An activity has been provided which the children will be completing in class. This activity has a science/literacy focus. Look at the factfiles written in Y1 friendly language (all decodable words) and your child will then need to write three facts of their own on an elephant, a lion and a zebra. Sentence stems have been provided if needed.</p> <p>Additionally, your child may wish to complete research on African animals to support work in Science, Geography and Art.
