Maths	Please see the Maths links provided for our present Unit of work, which is place value with numbers to 10. Each lesson has a video that will explain what work is being completed on each day and an exercise to complete. The school office will inform you which lesson you should start from.
Reading	<p>In class this week we will be reading <i>Handa's Surprise</i> by Eileen Brown. Reading Rocket stickers will be awarded on return to school.</p>
Writing	<p>In class this week we will be writing a thank you letter related to <i>Handa's Surprise</i> by Eileen Brown. Please use the following link:</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=XyIV_xYi0as</p> <p>This will give you an online version of the story. The two main characters are Handa and Akeyo. Write a letter in Akeyo's voice to say 'thank you' to Handa to her for bringing the tangerines to her village. Focus on using correct spelling, finger spaces, capital letters and full stops.</p>
SPAG	2 exercises have been provided which will complement the genre of writing your child will be completing. One is a phoneme spotter related to <i>Handa's Surprise</i> and the other is putting simply-worded sentences back together.
Foundation Subjects	An activity has been provided which the children will be completing in class. This activity is a science

based one whereby your child needs to cut out the body parts of different African animals and create their own, labelling the body parts. A fun and worthwhile activity.
