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Reading	<p>Please read your child's home reading book with them. Comment on their ability to read the words and how they answer simple questions on the text as you read. Ask simple questions which relate to the text and maybe ask questions relating to the main character/what they think will happen next. Reading Rocket star stickers will be awarded on return to school.</p>
Writing	<p>The writing activity is focused on <i>Handa's Surprise</i> by Eileen Brown. This book ties into a Amazing Africa topic and is a wonderful read!</p> <p>Here is a YouTube link for the story:</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=XyIV_xYi0as</p> <p>Wednesday: Write simple 'thank you' sentences to Handa.</p> <p>Thursday: Re-write the sentence with capital letters and full stops in.</p> <p>Friday: Write a short thank you letter (in the voice of Akeyo) to Handa.</p>
SPaG	<p>Monday focuses on writing key words/sentences using the pictures.</p> <p>Tuesday's activity does the same with different pictures.</p> <p>The word based SPaG encourages the children to use the phonics knowledge to look at the picture, think of the word, sound it out and then write it down in the correct place.</p> <p>If confident your child may want to look at the picture and write a sentence with a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop. Think the sentence, say it out loud, then write it.</p>

Spellings	Your child will need to practise the ten Y1 spelling words using the Look, Cover, Write, Check method from Monday-Thursday. You will then need to test them on these words on Friday to check how many they can score out of ten.
Science:	An activity has been provided which the children will be completing in class. This activity again has a Science focus as we are looking in detail at African animals. This task requires the children to determine what food the animals eat. The children have to categorise these animals into: carnivore, herbivore or omnivore. Think carefully!
R.E.	In R.E. ,after half-term, we start to focus on Christmas and this week's task focuses on creating a Christmas stamp. The stamp needs to be religiously themed and must be coloured brightly to stand out!
