The First World War

The time that the war ended was 11 a.m. and people take part in a moment of silence to remember all those that died. This happens in lots of countries around the world.



Why People Wear Red Poppies

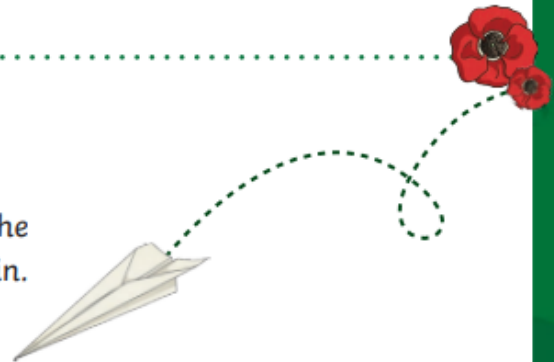
Poppies have become such a symbol for Remembrance Day that some people actually call Remembrance Day 'Poppy Day'.

After the First World War had ended, bright red poppies grew on the battlefields. That's why people now wear poppies on Remembrance Day.

Each year, people are given the chance to buy a poppy. The tradition of selling poppies began in 1921. Some of the money raised from the sale of poppies goes to charities. These charities use the money to try to help injured members of the armed forces and their families.

The First Remembrance Day in Britain

This is a diary entry that was written on the first Remembrance Day that was held in Britain.



11th November 1919

As I stood outside my house, there were lots of people standing in silence. It was an incredible sight.

Men were looking at the floor and holding their caps against their chests. Women wiped tears from their eyes and young children stood very still. Every person knew why they were taking part in this event. Amazingly, I even saw a horse stop and lower its head like it knew what was happening.

I will never forget this day.
