The following work has been set for any Year 1 child who may be self-isolating during this week. Please complete the activities in your Home Learning book and return this to school when your period of isolation is complete. Thank you.

Maths	Maths focuses on place value to 20 this week through a post assessment. Tuesday-Thursday this week is slightly different, as the children will be refreshing skills previously taught. Try to show your child practically with objects, so they can visualise the concept first before you move onto the paperbased work.
	Focus: Place Value within 20
	Monday: Post-assessment on place value to 20.
	Tuesday: Number bonds to 20 using the Singapore Bar.
	Wednesday: Drawing tens and ones (base ten/dienes) of numbers up to 50.
	Thursday: Drawing tens and ones (base ten/dienes) of numbers up to 50 with a 2s, 5s and 10s focus.
	Friday: Off for Christmas.
	I have also provided a week's worth of Quickstarts to hone your child's key basic Maths skills.
Reading	Please read your child's home reading book with them. Comment on their ability to read the words and how they answer simple questions on the text as you read. Ask simple questions which relate to the text and maybe ask questions relating to the main character/what they think will happen next. Reading Rocket star stickers will be awarded on return to school.

	Access lesson 1 and lesson 2 in order to listen to an explanation and to be able to tell an explanation from memory.
	Challenge: Retell your explanation to an adult using excellent memory skills!

	Explanation: how birds fly - Oak National Academy (thenational.academy)
	Access lesson 3 and lesson 4 to explore cause and effect and use subordinating conjunctions (so, if etc)
	Challenge: Relook over the written work completed for these lessons and 'fix' any mistakes.
SPaG	Monday focuses on writing key words/sentences using the pictures.
	Tuesday's activity does the same with different pictures.
	The word-based SPaG encourages the children to use the phonics knowledge to look at the picture, think of the word, sound it out and then write it down in the correct place.
	If confident your child may want to look at the picture and write a sentence with a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop. Think the sentence, say it out loud, and then write it.
Spellings	Your child will need to practise the ten Y1 spelling using the Look, Cover, Write, Check method from Monday-Thursday. You will then need to test them on these words on Friday to check how many they can score out of ten.

Science:	Animals Including Humans
	This is the final task on African animals. The pictures are of an elephant and a honey badger. Your child needs to label the bodyparts as accurately as possible, using phonics to sound out and spell the bodyparts accurately.
	Challenge: Write one/two sentences about the bodyparts of each animal. Use scientific language where possible.
R.E.	How do we know its Christmas? (Outdoors, Part 2)
	In this task, I would like you to think about the things at Christmas you can <b>smell</b> , <b>hear</b> , <b>touch</b> , <b>see and taste</b> . Draw and label and example of each. This is similar to last week's, but I would like you to think about 'the Outdoors.'
	<b>Challenge:</b> Write a sentence about each picture you have drawn. Make sure it relates to Christmas.
