## **Stoneferry Corridor Redevelopment**

Next week the development of the Stoneferry Corridor will start outside of school. I have been in meetings with the developer to ensure that all the necessary safety measures are in place, and from Monday the pavement outside of school will not be accessible for hopefully no more than 2 weeks. A temporary pedestrian walkway will be created which will involve closing one lane of the carriageway, and access to the gates into and outside of school will remain as usual. No building activity will take place when children are entering or leaving school too.

Due to the current situation in school, it was agreed that this would be the best possible time to complete this phase of the work to disrupt as few people as possible.

## **Greater Interaction with Teachers**

As teachers become more confident with Teams and how it can support learning and the children, we are looking each week to improve our Remote Learning more and more. We understand the impact teachers have on the children so from next week, teachers will be increasing the amount of interaction they have with the children. This will include starting a story time session with the children and possibly a well-being discussion. Individual teachers will explain how they will manage these sessions through their live checkins at the start of the week.

I am very aware, through experience with my own children, that the children will be missing their friends and hope that a managed activity will give them an opportunity to do this from now on.

## **Free School Meal Vouchers**

Children eligible for Free School Meal vouchers will receive these either through the post like last time or through email at the start of next week. Please can the parents of children eligible for the vouchers check their emails at the beginning of next week and let the school know if you need any support. These vouchers are not linked to Universal Free Dinners which all children up to Year 2 receive.
