Sound

- Find patterns between pitch of sounds and features of objects producing the sounds
- Find patterns between volume and strength of vibrations
- Identify how sounds are made in association with vibrations
- Recognise that sound gets fainter as the distance from the sound source increases

- Improve skills of overlapping and overlaying to place objects in front and behind
- cut multiple shapes with scissors and arrange/ stick these on a surface for a purpose
- experiment with creating mood, feeling movement and areas of interest using different media, interpret stories, music, poems and other stimuli and represent these using mixed media elements,
- use the natural/ town environment as a stimulus for mixed media work to convey meaning,
- make representational textures images from found textures that have been selected

Printing

- Overprinting, multicoloured, how artists progress (Warhol, Escher, William Morris), Mono printing – extending by adding more detail, repeat with different colours to create a collage, relief print using polystyrene, masking tape/ stencil on fabric, printing repeat patterns, make your own patter block
