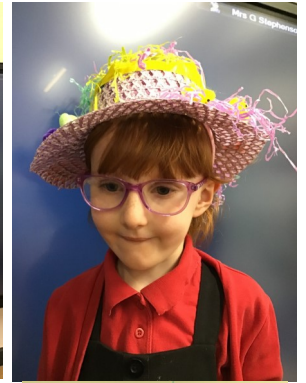
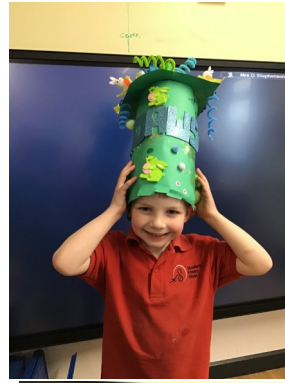
Cycle Shelter Update

This week I had 2 companies come and measure up for a new bike and scooter shelter. Hopefully, these will be installed soon and this will encourage more children to travel to school like this.

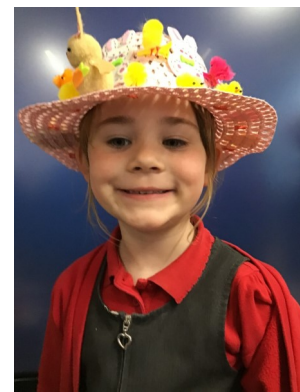
EYFS Open Day

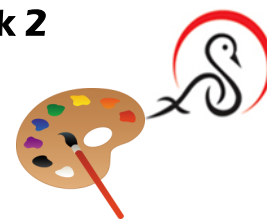
