Pupil Premium Impact 2021-22

Below is the impact of the pupil premium in the academic year 21-22:

- 100% of children in EYFS made ELG for reading.
- Targeted support in writing impacted positively on progress for disadvantaged pupils, with an average progress measure of +2.2 in 2022.
- Targeted intervention for those pupils who are PP on the RWI program (borne out of weekly Read Write Inc meetings)
- 50 recommended read for each key stage are now in each classroom and pupil premium have access to these texts and read them regularly.
- EWO check-in every morning with all classes and supports pupil premium children with emotional and well-being needs on a regular basis so they are ready to learn.
- Attendance at our Breakfast Club/After School care club of Pupil Premium has increased.
- After school learning club for Y6 was well-attended by PP Y6 children, results from SATS show this had an impact.
- 89% of children in Y1 passed the phonics screening check. 75% pupils eligible for PP passed the check in Y1.
- By the summer term PP attendance across the school was over 90%
- By the end of the summer term 25 PP children attended after school clubs.
